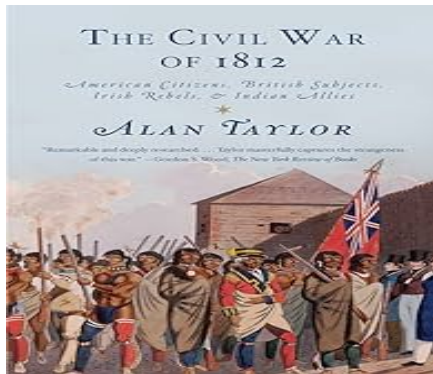


The Civil War of 1812: American Citizens, British Subjects, Irish Rebels, Indian Allies By Alan Taylor
