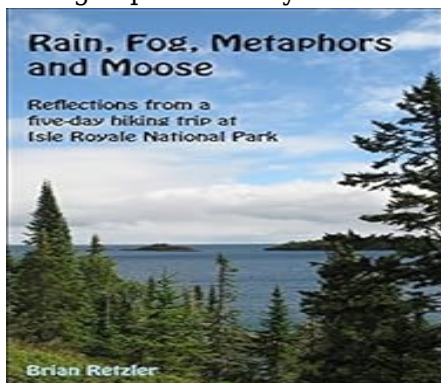


Rain, Fog, Metaphors and Moose: Reflections from a five-day hiking trip at Isle Royale National Park

How does it feel to bask in the warmth of the sun on a remote shoreline or feel the shiver of the nighttime chill while rain falls all around you? Have you ever encountered a moose in the wild or been awestruck by the Milky Way spread across the pitch-black sky?
